

Legislative Updates

It is my hope you have set up the groundwork for action by building relationships with your representatives this fall. **The NCGA's session convenes this Wednesday, January 10th.** I encourage you to meet with Senators and Representatives to discuss issues related to education. Please let me know when you make these contacts and don't forget to use the Eta State 2017 Legislative Priorities (linked below) when speaking on behalf of Delta Kappa Gamma.

One of DKGs top legislative priorities is to **encourage the General Assembly to increase per-pupil funding.** An unfunded mandate by the Legislature caps class sizes in kindergarten through 3rd grade. Without state funding, local Boards of Education must pay for this requirement entirely using local funds appropriated by local County Commissions. Paying for the extra teachers, the additional classroom space and all the teaching materials would all need to come out of already-tight local coffers. Public Schools 1st NC is holding an old fashioned Advocacy Day Wednesday, January 10, 2018 from 9AM to 1PM. Come visit your elected representatives to ask them to fully fund the K-3 class size mandate and to delay the impending fiasco caused by its current form. Ask them to restore the ratios used in the original HB13 and allow hardship waivers for school districts that cannot provide the additional teachers, classroom space, or financial resources beginning with the 2018-19 school year. Our schools must have enhancement

(or specials) teachers FULLY funded in January to allow time for budgeting. Join us in asking our legislators to RESTORE CAPS to Grades 4 and 5 that they removed in 2013!




Professional Development Grant Applications Online
